1. Why did Paul go to Macedonia?
2. Look at the list of companions that Paul had with him. What did it reveal about the extent of Paul's ministry across these regions?
3. What did Paul do in the church of Troas and how did it encourage the church (v7-12)?
4. What does this passage reveal about Paul's heart for the church and ministry?
5. What does this passage reveal about the life of the early church and their relationships with one another?
6. The early church was bustling with activity as its members related to one another in the gospel and in love. What can meaningful and deep gospel relationships look like in the church?
7. Think about how we usually go about our lives and relationships in the church. To what extent does participating in numerous church activities guarantee meaningful and deep relationships?
8. What are some reasons we struggle to participate in meaningful relationships in Jesus' church?
9. Think about how Paul encouraged the churches and raised gospel companions. What is the connection between Jesus' death and resurrection and our relationships with one another (Ephesians 2:13-22)?
10. How does this encourage and shape us to meaningfully walk with one another in the church?
11. One way we can respond to Jesus is to pray for these relationships, brothers and sisters that Jesus has given through Jesus' church. On our own, think about these existing relationships that Jesus has given us through His body and commit them to prayer. Ask Jesus to reveal to us individually who in our CG we can meaningfully love and walk with, and how we can walk with them.
